





#### SUBMISSION

In America today this word is probably the most hated word in our vocabulary. Especially those who are involved in the Equal Rights Movement, National Organization of Women, Gay Rights, Pro-Abortion Movement and Humanism and other people who want to "do your own thing."

These people want to be free from authority of parents, teachers, bosses, law enforcement, government and **God!** The church is being influenced by these people and their way of thinking. Yes, there are men, women and children in the Lord's church who think it's O.K. to "do your own thing".

But this is not so in the Bible!

Webster's Dictionary's definition for "submission" is this: "The condition of being submissive, humble or compliant; an act of submitting to the authority or control of another." In other words, this means to be under obedience, giving up your rights (self) to please another person or to yield (give in) to another.

Let me illustrate: suppose you are driving down a highway and you see a car preparing to enter the highway. You slow down to let him get on the highway. In the same way, whenever someone like your boss asks you to do something for him, you would be willing to do what he asked. You do this by giving up your selfish desires rather than doing it your own way. Here are some verses from the Bible that tell us to be submissive to those who are over us:

Romans 13:1- Everyone must submit himself to the governing authorities...

Ephesians 5:21- Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Ephesians 5:22- Wives, submit to your husband as to the Lord.

James 4:7- Submit therefore to God.


1 Peter 2:13- Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every authority instituted among men...

1 Peter 2:18- Submit yourselves to your masters (bosses) with all respect...

Is God's Word considered old-fashioned in today's world? Are we blindly accepting the ways of the world which influence us to "do things our way"? We readily accept and use statements like this:

This is my body, I'll do whatever I want!
If it feels good, do it!
Nobody can tell me what I can do or not to do!
I'll do it my way!

Do you have too much pride to submit?



The terrible disease leprosy is mentioned about 67 times in the Bible.

Here are a few passages that mention leprosy:

- 1. Moses' hand. Exodus 4:6.
- 2. Miriam's punishment. Numbers 12:10.
- Naaman. 2 Kings 5:1.
   Gehazi. 2 Kings 5:5.
- -5. Azariah. 2 Kings 15:5.
- 6. Uzziah. 2 Chronicles 26:21.7. Simon. Matthew 26:6.

The Jewish law was strict about leprosy. You may read Leviticus 13-14 in the Old Testament if you want to know what were the rules that Moses gave about this disease.

- of course, but leprosy also goes a long way back in the world's his-
- 2. Both leprosy and sin are worldwide, 11 people world-wide suffer from it. But sin afflicts all people (Romans 3:23).
- 3. Both leprosy and sin cause separation. Lepers (people suffering from leprosy) must live in colonies apart from other people. 3,000 suffer from Americans leprosy and are staying special hospitals Louisana and Hawaii. Sin separates man from God (Isaiah 59:2). Sin  $\begin{array}{cccc} {\sf also} & {\sf separates} & {\sf sinners} \\ {\sf from} & {\sf God's} & {\sf people} & ({\sf Luke} \end{array}$ 6:22, 2 Corinthians 6:17).

- 4. Both leprosy and sin are contagious. This means that the disease can spread to other people. Leprosy is not easily communicable but can spread to other people by touch or contact. It is the same with sin (1 Corinthians 5:6, 15:33, Ephesians 2:3, Ezekiel 18:20).
- 5. Both leprosy and sin can fool people. Leprosy starts with a small, innocent sore. The person who has this sore does not think that the sore is a serious one, so he does not give attention to it. But as the disease progresses, the person's nerve endings are destroyed and he cannot feel pain any more. Later the disease will cause the person's fingers to fall off, and maybe even his nose. He looks horrible. Sin does the same thing! Sin, like leprosy, seems painless at first. The person may actually enjoy it! But the more the

person sins, the more his conscience will be destroyed. And then the person does not feel sorry for the wrongs he did. The pain caused by sin is gone (1 Timothy 4:2)! In this way sin destroys the person! James tells how sin progresses:

a. First, there is evil desire.

b. Then the actual act, sin, happens.

c. Finally, death (separation forever from God) happens!

Read James 1:14,15.

6. Both leprosy and sin cannot be cured by people. See Hebrews 9:14, 1 John 1:9, Revelation 1:5.

Is there a cure for sin at all? Yes, there is! It is the Lord Jesus! Read Acts 16:31; Mark 16:15,16; Ephesians 5:26,27; and 2 Corinthians 7:1. Believe and trust in Jesus, and obey Him in baptism. Your sins will be washed away (Acts 22:16)! You will find life forever in Jesus!






## QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

## Q

If a person doesn't attend church for a long time, can he become worn out? Does he sin?

#### A

We are not sure what you mean by becoming "worn out". Of course the person who does not attend assembly sins (Hebrews 10:25), but he does not suffer any physical fatigue (tiredness). Maybe, though, he is tired of doing good! There is a verse that answers this: "We must not become tired of doing good. We will receive our harvest of eternal life at the right time. we must not give up! (Galatians 6:9).

## Q

Are those many churches that are not New Testament churches who baptize people playing and fooling around with people because they (the churches) don't understand the Bible when they read it?

#### A

"Playing and fooling around with people" means that the person or persons is/are not sincere (honest). Many of these non-New Testament churches hold on to men's traditions, not to Jesus' teaching as shown

in the Bible. Some of these churches' members are sincere and are ignorant that the Bible teaches differently from group's teachings. We cannot see in their hearts, so we do know which are and which are not. But we should try to reach them with the pure New Testament gospel. And here we must be careful that we ourselves not "play around" with people! and fool Teaching the truth is serious business!

## Q

Does God hate sinners because they won't listen or obey God?

#### A

No! John 3:16 tells us that God loves all the world. This includes even the worst sinner! Paul tells us this most amazing truth— "While we were God's enemies, God made friends with us through the death of His Son (Romans 5:10)". God hates sin, but not sinners.

## Q

If a person continues to pray and talk to God every day, will God forgive that person for his sins? If not, that means God will not forgive that person, right? If God will not forgive that person, then God will let that person have trouble with other people, Right?



Just because a person prays to God every day will not guarantee that God will forgive his sins. That person must obey God. Jesus talked about people who honored God with their mouths, but did not really make Him an important part of their lives (Matthew 15:8). Praying is good, and should be done, but we must live the kind of life God wants us to. The apostle John says, "So if we say that we have fellowship with God. but we continue living in darkness (sin), then we are liars- we don't follow the truth. (1 John 1:6)" This means that we must stop sinning if we want to have fellowship with God. But John goes on to tell us the good news: "But if we confess (admit) our sins, then God will forgive We can trust God. our sins. God does what is right. will make us clean from all the wrong things we have done (1 John 1:9)."

Q

If a person gets along with God in prayer for a long time during his life and then dies, then Jesus will come to take him up to heaven?

#### A

When we die, we will not go to heaven right away. We remind you of what Jesus said:
"A time is coming when all people who are dead and in their graves will hear His voice. Then they will come out of their graves (John 5:28-29)."
They could not be in heaven if Jesus says they would be

in their graves! The evidence that we can find from the Bible shows that we will rest like we are asleep. When Jesus comes again, we will all be raised back to life and taken to heaven with Jesus (1 Corinthians 15:23; 1 Thessalonians 4:16, 17).



If a person in Christ happens to die from cancer, will the person's holy spirit quickly go to heaven?



We are not sure what you mean by the person's "holy spirit". There is only one Holy Spirit (Ephesians 4:4). We can only guess that you are talking about the person's spirit who has been made holy by his accepting the Lord Jesus Christ. Our answer to this question is the same as our answer to the previous question. A Christian, no matter how he dies, will not go to heaven right away. But he will go there when our Savior Jesus Christ comes again.


#### Q

If a person won't listen to God or if he leaves God's Word, will God remove that person's name in heaven? Does this mean the person who is a Christian but not a non-Christian?



It means any person who would try to change God's Word! Read Revelation 22:18,19.
