May you be blessed as you read.

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

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

QUESTION

I notice the "Awake" and "Watchtower" publications from the Jehovah's Witnesses. What about the person who doesn't believe heaven, hell, or the Holy Bible but believes in the "Awake" and "Watchtower" magazines; is he saved?

ANSWER

The Jehovah's Witnesses claim that they believe the Bible, but they require their members to read "Awake" and "Watchtower" along with the Bible. This is their way of preventing members from studying the truth for themselves. We do not have time in this space to explain where the Jehovah's Witnesses are mistaken in their teachings, but our answer is that Jesus Christ is the only way to heaven (John 14:6 and Acts 4:12). Jesus gave us the Holy Bible to read and learn. We must study it! All men's publications, even Light for the Deaf, are not perfect and contain mistakes. must measure men's publications by the Bible. If what they teach agrees with the Bible,

well and fine! But if they disagree with the Bible, then beware!

QUESTION

Suppose a Christian knows everything in the Bible, but never reads the Word of God. Does this mean he tells a lie? Is he still in sin?

ANSWER

I would be afraid to say "Yes" or "No" because some Christians have never learned to read, so they have to listen to the preacher or someone read the Bible in the pulpit. If they know the Word of God without reading, then fine and well. But if a person can read, but refuses to read, then he can be in sin. This isn't always true, because a person may still be on a very low reading level. average low-verbal deaf American has a reading level around the third grade. So although he can read, many passages in the King James Version of the Bible are too difficult for him.So he feels frusterated and gives up. The person who can read, but who doesn't want to read, is robbing himself of a precious encounter with God.

QUESTION

If a Christian is sick for a long time, and can't go to church, is that okay? Or must he go to church regularly?

ANSWER

God never requires something that is impossible for His children. We should think of our sick members and visit them when possible. Of course if a person's health permits him, he should attend the assembly of the saints.

QUESTION

This husband and wife both are not Christians. The husband has sexual relations with another woman and leaves his wife. He files for a divorce. He marries the other woman. The wife never has had sexual relations with another man. Does this mean the husband is sinning?

ANSWER

Let our Lord answer your question plainly: "I tell you that any person that divorces his wife and marries another woman is guilty of the sin of adultery" (Matthew 19:9, EVD). (See also Mark 10:11.)

QUESTION

In the same case above, is the woman innocent of sin?

ANSWER

Our Lord said, "The only reason for a person to divorce and marry again is if his first wife had sexual relations with another man" (Matthew 19:9, (EVD). The same is true of the wife. We believe that it does not matter if it was the sinning spouse or the innocent spouse who filed for divorce, the innocent spouse has not done the sin of adultery.


QUESTION

I read 1 Corinthians 11:25 in the EVD (English Version for the Deaf) where it says, "In the same way, after they ate, Jesus took the cup of wine. Jesus said, 'This wine shows the new agreement from God to His people. This new agreement begins with My blood (death). When you drink this, do it to remember Me." I ask you: does this wine mean juice?


ANSWER

The original Greek does not say "wine"; the EVD supplied this word. But it was the Passover wine that Jesus had in the cup at the Last Supper with His apostles. In the U.S.A., when we say "wine", we mean an alcoholic drink. But in Bible times "wine" meant either an alcoholic drink or fresh grape juice! Only the context can tell us which is meant. Since Jesus does not want us to get drunk, I would think that my answer is yes, the "wine" in 1 Corinthians 11:25 is grape juice.



As one grows into the likeness of Christ, he begins to see things from a different viewpoint.


