CHRIST THE SAME TODAY

While I was young, I studied the Bible and found I needed to obey Christ in baptistm for the remission of my sins.

In the summer of 1935, on a Monday night, there was a prayer meeting at my parents' house. I told the preacher there (Brother Herron) that I wanted to be baptized. He asked me why. I answered, "To wash away my sins." Then he showed me some verses and asked if I believed them. I replied, "Yes." He then told the group that I was conditioned to be baptized. The next day at the bank of the Trout River in northern Jacksonville. Florida, my hometown, Brother Herron baptized me in the river. My mother was in the gathering who witnessed my baptism. remember the happiness I felt on the way home.

The next Sunday we gathered for worship and I began to learn many things a new Christian should do. My knowledge of God has grown ever since and I have kept the faith until this day, 56 years later in the same church of Christ. I see the same gospel today that I saw then. No difference! I also have preached it since then.

The reason for giving the above story of my conversion is to show how simple the gospel can be even though it was given to the Apostles by Jesus Christ nearly 2,000 years ago. The same gospel was preached by the Apostles then that is preached by us now. It is not lost. It is in the Bible. Anyone, even today, can come to Christ and obey His gospel to be saved. The gospel will be the same years ahead and even forever. Hebrews 13:3 says: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever." So is the gospel!

Christ was God in the beginning. He became flesh exactly in the likeness of God on earth (John 1:1-4 and 14). He had the power of saving anybody, even in the Old Testament. Christ is able to save from the beginning to the end of our world's duration (Hebrews 7:25). Christ saved Abel, one of the first of the human family. During every period from then to the present He has been displaying His saving power. His ability to save is still alive and effective by His gospel and will keep its full power until the last sinner of our fallen world shall be brought from darkness to light and

from Satan to God (Romans 1:16).

John 8:56-58 tells us that Christ was there before Abraham. Jesus told the Jews, "Your father Abraham rejoiced to see My day, and he saw it and was glad." The Jews said to Him, "You are not yet fifty years old, and have You seen Abraham?" Jesus' answer was, "Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM." That tells us Jesus was there long before then, even eternally. Christ is the same yesterday!

Also Colossians 1:15-19 says, "No person can see God. Jesus is ruler over all the things that have been made. Through His power all things were made-- things in heaven and on earth, things seen and not seen, all spiritual powers, authorities, lords and rulers. All things were made through Christ and for Christ. Christ was there before anything was made. All things continue because of Him. Christ is the head of the body (the body is the church). Everything comes from Him. He is the Lord

who was raised from the dead. So in all things Jesus is most important. God was pleased for all of Himself to live in Christ." Since God is eternal and Christ helped create all things, Christ is also eternal. Christ is the same yesterday and forever!

Now Christ rules us in this Christian age with His gospel of salvation, and we all can have the promise of eternal life. Christ is the same today!

The gospel has the same conditions of salvation for all time. A sinner is to meet them in order to be saved from sins. They are: (1) Believe Jesus Christ; (2) Repent of your sins; (3) Confess Christ as Lord, the Son of God; (4) Be baptized (immersed) for the remission of sins. Then God adds the saved to the church and the person becomes a new Christian who needs to stay faithful to Him using the New Testament for spiritual growth till death. Then he will receive the promised life eternal. The gospel of Christ is the same today till the end of time.

CONTINUE TO BE FAITHFUL TO GOD!

On one occasion while Jesus was teaching a group of people, a woman from the crowd said to Jesus, "Blessed is the womb that bore You, and the breast that nursed You." Jesus answered her, "More than that, blessed are those [people] who HEAR the word of God and KEEP It" (Luke 11:27,28)*.

Many people who decide to obey the gospel of Christ and to become Christians, do not continue to be faithful to God very long. Each Christian who fails to remain faithful does not understand the importance of preparing for eternal life with God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

What does the word "falthful" mean? "Falthful" means to be loyal or worthy of trust, like a falthful friend or a falthful servant of God. This faithful servant (any person who serves

God) uses his time wisely, daily, living and doing things that make God happy and pleased with him.

Each person has two choices in life. He is free to choose which: One, to obey God, and to do things daily to please God until death; or Two, not to obey God, and to suffer eternal punishment in "flaming fire" after Judgment Day.

People who become Christians are to "continue stedfastly [faithfully] in the apostles' doctrine [teaching] and fellowship, in the breaking of bread [the Lord's Supper], and in prayer" (Acts 2:42). "Now all who believed were together, and had all things common... So continuing daily with one accord..." (Acts 2:44,46).

EXAMPLES OF WHAT FAITHFULNESS DOES FOR PEOPLE WHO OBEY GOD'S TEACHING

Before the great flood, "the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that

every intent [aim, purpose] of the thoughts of his [man's] heart was only evil continually" (Genesis 6:5). Because of the sinfulness of the people on the earth, the Lord God said He would destroy all flesh. "But Noah found grace in the eves of the Lord". Why? Because "Noah walked with God" (Genesis 6:8,9c). "By faith Noah, being divinely warned of things not yet seen, moved with godly fear, prepared an ark for the saving of his household, by which he condemned the world and became heir of righteousness which is according to faith" (Hebrews 11:7).

God "did not spare the ancient world, but saved Noah, one of eight people, a preacher of righteousness, bringing in the flood on the world of the ungodly" (2 Peter 2:5).

All the people who refused and failed to respect God and to obey God's preaching through Noah, were punished and destroyed with the ancient world.

Why did God say to Abraham, "In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed"? God's answer: "Because you [Abraham] obeyed My [God's] voice" (Genesis 22:18). And why did Abraham obey God? Because by faith Abraham desired "a better, that is, a heavenly country. Therefore [for this reason], God is not ashamed to be called their [the faithful people's] God, for He [God] has prepared a city [home in heaven] for them" (Hebrews 11:16).

Faithfulness meant much in the life of the apostle Paul. First, he thought he had to fight against the name of Jesus, and persecuted those who believed in Jesus (Acts 26:1-23). But Paul changed and now followed Jesus. Through the vears. Paul suffered because he was teaching and preaching Christ to save all people possible. The unbelieving Jews in different cities caused much trouble against Paul. Several times the unbelievers tried to kill Paul for teaching the truth. Paul had been whipped, stoned and shipwrecked, but he continued to be faithful to God in all things. Jesus said, "But he who endures [continues] to the end shall be saved" (Matthew 24:13).

Don't be foolish with your life. You must continue to be faithful each day you are blessed with life on earth. doing only what the Bible says will please God. If you want to go to heaven, you must continue to love God and continue to meet together with the Lord's family to worship God in spirit and truth every week. NOT just once a year, or once a month, BUT EVERY WEEK. cannot continue enjoying the pleasures of the world and expect to go to heaven.

The Bible says, "If we say we have fellowship with Him [God], and walk in darkness [sin], we lie and do not practice truth. But if we walk in the light as He [God] is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of

Jesus Christ cleanses us from all sin" (1 John 1:6.7).



If you continue using your life daily doing your best to serve God, you will be able to say as the apostle Paul did: "The time of my departure is at hand [near]. I have fought the good fight, I have

finished the race, I have kept the faith. Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that day, and not to me only but also to all who have loved His appearing" (2 Timothy 4:6-8).
