4:7)! (2) Jesus gave us an example (1 Peter 2:21). He lived as a man on earth and gave us a model for us to follow. If He can defeat the devil, so can we! (With help from Jesus, of course.)

And finally, you will notice on our front cover we say "Satan is alive and well on Earth." This is all too true.

1 Peter 5:8,9 warns us: "Control yourselves and be careful! The devil is your enemy. And he goes around like a roaring lion looking for some person to eat. Refuse to follow the devil. Stand strong in your faith" (EVD).

But the Devil will not have the Earth in his grasp forever! The Bible promises the Devil will be destroyed in the lake of fire and brimstrone (Revelation 20:10)!


Then I would discourage discussion of morality and abstinence-- I would encourage sex education for high schools that would focus on the giving out of condoms with instructions in their usage.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Must a person repent before he can be saved?

Yes, a person must repent before he can be saved. Jesus told His disciples, "You must go and tell people that their sins can be forgiven. Tell them that they must change their hearts and be sorry for their sins. If they will do this, then God will forgive them" (Luke 24:47-48). The King James Version of this same passage says "repent". And Peter said, "Change your hearts and lives and be baptized, each one of you in the name of Jesus Christ. Then God will forgive your sins, and you will

receive the gift of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:38). The King James also says "repent" in this passage. The EVD makes it clear that we must change our hearts and lives, for that is exactly what the Greek word translated "repent" means-- a change of mind which will lead to a change of life. A person who thinks he is a Christian but who continues to sin without repenting will probably have an unpleasant surprise for him on the Judgment Day.

Can Christians stray so far from God that they never come back?

It is true, Christians who stray far from God can reach a point of "no return": that is, they never come back to Him. If they go near that point, then they are putting their souls in great danger. These Christians who stray far away can find themselves judged to eternal punishment. Hebrews 10:26-27 has this serious warning for us: "If we decide to continue sinning after we have learned the truth, then there is no other sacrifice that will take away sins. If we continue sinning, all we have is fear in waiting for the judgment and the angry fire that will destroy all people who live against God." And

verse 31 of this same chapter sums it up: "It is a terrible thing for a sinful person to fall into the hands of the living God." Best never ever stray from the Lord in the first place!

As long as a Christian is alive who has strayed, there is **hope** that he might later come back to Jesus. But if that person dies without having turned back to Jesus, then there is no hope for him. The writer of Hebrews gives us this warning: "Every person must die once. After a person dies, he is judged" (9:27).

Let us stay faithful to Jesus!
