






# SHODDY SINGING AND STODGY SERMONS



Our hymn-singing may be considered poor and our gospel-preaching dull. Accepting that the hymns we sing and the sermons we hear must be Scriptural, it is desirable that we do our best to sing sweetly and that our preachers try to preach persuasively.

But it is a fact that few congreations, among the thousands world-wide, have superb singers, trained song-leaders and professional speakers. Most are composed of ordinary men and women who earnestly "worship God in spirit and truth" (John 4:24)-- that is, with the right attitude (even if the singing is discordant) and with the right teaching (even if the preaching is plain).

For many centuries, God's people chanted simple hymns and heard sermons from unschooled men, but they were no less spiritual for so doing.

Our deaf brethren are among the most stedfast within our fellowship and yet they can neither hear hymn tunes nor spoken sermons.

Do we make the quality of the singing and speaking a condition of loyality to brethren?

## THE WORD WAS MADE

# FLESH

"Before the world began, the word was there... and the word became a man and lived among us" (John 1:1,14, EVD).

"In the beginning was the word, and the word was made flesh" (John 1:1, KJV).

The fact that the Word was made flesh implies that the Word existed prior to becoming flesh. It is clearly taught that the Word is a member of the Godhead, the One known as **Jesus Christ**, the Son of God. His becoming flesh, through conception in the womb of Mary the virgin, was not the beginning of His existence. This truth is indicated in other places.

Jesus told some of the Jews, "Before Abraham was born, I AMI" (John 8:58). He existed before the days of Abraham. His prayer in John 17:5 includes these words, "Give Me the glory I had with You before the world was made." Thus, His birth into the world did not mark the beginning of His existence.

The Word was made flesh. He took upon Himself traits of humanity. He had the qualities of both deity and humanity.

Some, in the time while the New Testament was being written, denied that Jesus had come in the flesh. This false teaching was confronted in 1 John 4:2-3 and 2 John 7. "One spirit says, 'I believe... that spirit is from God: and another spirit refuses... that spirit is the enemy of Christ."

#### **BE THOU FAITHFUL!**

Several years ago, when there was much trouble in Uganda, some rebels came into a town and caused severe problems for the inhabitantsof the people of the town was a Christian man. When the soldiers discovered that he was a Christian, they put a bottle of beer in front of him and demanded that he drink it. The man refused. They beat him, and still he refused. They threatened to kill him, but even that threat could not persuade him to drink. Finally, because of his refusal, they told him they would cut off his lips, and that is just what they did. They cut off his lips, cooked them, and forced the man's wife to eat them. This poor Christian and h is wife suffered terribly because of their desire to serve the Lord faithfully, even if it meant torture, or even death.

I believe we can see in this man's example that he loved not his life unto the death. Please read the following passages from Revelation chapter 12:

10. And I heard a loud voice saying in heaven, Now is come salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of His Christ: for the accuser of our brethren is cast down, which accused them before our God day and night. 11. And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death.

The word of God is given to us so that we might find daith, and that our faith might increase. The more we read and study the word of God the more our faith should grow:

Romans 10:17: So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

As our faith grows we are more able to withstand the temptations of

Satan, and the evil things that he tries to do to us. Very often, Satan uses wicked men to torment the Christian, as we see in the case above. When we look into the Bible, we will see many other examples of the faithul ones of God being persecuted by Satan. A good example of that is Job.

Please take a few minutes and read the first chapter of Job. After you have finished you should see at least four things:

- 1. Satan is always among us, ready and eager to trouble us, and:
- 2. God knows our hearts, and can see the faithfulness we have, or do not have, and:
- 3. Satan is ready to find excuses for our faithfulness, and eager to torment us to prove that we are faithful only because we have it very easy, and finally:
- 4. God will allow Satan to buffet us, but will not allow him to go to far (see 1 Corinthians 10:13).

As you read the remainder of the book of Job, you will see how terribly Satan persecuted Job, but you will also see that Job remained faithful, and did not blame God for his troubles. Even though Job lost all that he owned, including his children, and even his health still he remained faithful. He loved not his life unto the death.

I believe the greatest example of someone not loving His own life is the example of Jesus Christ. Think about Him. Jesus was in heaven where every heavenly being served HIm. Anything that He commanded the angels quickly ran to obey Him. He sat on a throne beside His Father and the Holy Spirit. He was God, almighty, all-knowing, King of kings, Lord of lords. Then one day He left heaven, gave up His equality with His Father (Philippians 2:1-12), and became a man. And when He became a man He did not become a mighty ruler, as He could have, but instead He became a small baby, born of parents who were poor and weak. He was raised in a little town that was despised by most people. He was not raised in the Capitol city of the world, Rome. He did not brow up among the great religious men of His day who lived in Jerusalem, and served in the temple. No, He lived as a peasant boy until the day He went to be baptized of John.

After Jesus began His ministry, He did not force people to obey Him. Instead He preached love and kindness. He served the people. He healed the sick, gave sight to the blind, and even raised the dead. He did all of these things so that He could save people. The signs and wonders were only proofs that He came from God, but the life He lived was a living example of Who and What God really is.

After living as a servant for about 33 years, Jesus traveled to Jerusalem. There He met the men who hated Him. The religious people of His day hated Him so badly that they decided to see to it that He was put to death. So they arranged with Judas to betray Him, then they took Jesus to the authorities, and eventually they led HIm to be crucified. During all this time Jesus had the power to stop them. He could have spoken the word and God would have sent 12 legions of angels to help... but He did not. HE LOVED NOT HIS LIFE UNTO THE DEATH!

In order to save us Jesus knew that He had to offer Himself as a sacrifice. His blood had to be shed, because without the shedding of blood there is no remission. Therefore, Jesus willingly let the very people He created kill Him. He gave us the supreme example of someone who did not love His life even unto death. He was more in love with us and His Father than He had His own life.

His life and death then ought to serve as an example to us that there are some things that are greater than our lives. To gain our lives and lose our souls is no gain at all. It is for sure that we will all die someday. It is better to die while serving the Lord faithfully, than to die while denying Him.

God bless all of us as we seek to serve the Lord, and as we LOVE NOT OUR LIVES UNTO THE DEATH!

- 4. Cleansing Hands. (Matt. 8:3).
- 5. Life giving hands.
- 6. Healing hands.

#### II. THE LORD AND HIS ARTIFICIAL HANDS

- Since the Lord died upon the cross and then went into heaven we can think of him now having artificial hands.
- a. Sometime the artificial hands are worth more than the real hands.
- b. Artificial hands if trained right can be very useful.
- 2. Each Christian might be thought of as being the artificial hands of Jesus.
- 3. It is by us who are Christians that the Lord is still working.

#### III. YOUR HANDS

- 1. Use them to bring glory to God in all that you do.
- 2. Find something to do with your hands for the Lord.
- Think of yourself as a person who is doing the Lord's work.

There are many important things that we can do with our hands for our own needs. We can be important when we use them for our spiritual life. Our hands should be doing important things for the Lord. Let us use our hands to serve the Lord as we have never done before.


