THE EARTH ROTATES (SPINS), MAKING DAY AND NIGHT.





THE EARTH TILTS ON ITS **AXIS**, MAKING **SEASONS**.




THE EARTH REVOLVES (GOES AROUND)

THE BABYLONIANS AND EGYPTIANS MADE CALENDARS, BUT THESE CALENDARS WERE NOT PERFECT.




THIS IS THE EARLY ROMAN CALENDAR. IT SHOWS WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH OF AUGUST.

JANUARY IS THE FIRST MONTH OF THE YEAR AND IS NAMED FOR JANUS, A ROMAN GOD OF GATES.

FEBRUARY IS NAMED FOR FEBRUARIUS (LATIN MEANING "TO PURIFY").

MARCH IS NAMED FOR MARTIUS (MARS, THE ROMAN GOD OF WAR).

APRIL IS
NAMED FOR
APRILIS
(LATIN MEANING
"TO OPEN"), OR
APHRODITE,
GREEK GODDESS
OF LOVE.

MAY IS

NAMED FOR

MAIA, THE

ROMAN GODDESS

OF SPRING AND

GROWTH. (THE

LATIN WORD

"MAJORES MEANS
"OLDER MEN".)

JUNE IS NAMED FOR JUNO, THE ROMAN GODDESS OF MARRIAGE. (THE LATIN WORD "JUNIORES" MEANS YOUNG MEN").

JULY IS NAMED FOR JULIUS CAESAR (ROMAN GENERAL AND STATESMAN). THIS MONTH WAS FORMERLY CALLED "QUINTILUS" (FIVE: THE FIFTH MONTH OF THE ROMAN CALENDAR.)







AUGUST IS NAMED FOR AUGUSTUS, WHO WAS THE FIRST ROMAN EMPEROR. (THIS MONTH WAS FORMERLY CALLED "SEXTILIS" (SIX; THE SIXTH MONTH OF THE ROMAN CALENDAR.)

SUNDAY: FIRST DAY OF THE WEEK COMES FROM THE ROMAN HOLIDAY DIES SOUS (SUN'S DAY).

THE CHRISTIANS FROM NEW TESTAMENT TIMES HAVE HONORED SUNDAY AS THE DAY CHRIST ROSE FROM THE DEAD, AND ON THIS DAY CHRISTIANS TAKE THE LORD'S SUPPER.





MONDAY: THE WORD COMES FROM THE & ANGLO-SAXON MONANDAEG (MOON'S DAY).

TUESDAY: NAMED FOR THE NORSE GOD OF WAR. TIU OR TIV OR TIW SON OF WODEN).

WEDNESDAY: FROM WODEN, THE CHIEF GOD OF THE NORSES.


Thank God for sowing His seed in us that we may have true

Why Did God forsake Jesus on the Cross?

And about the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? That is to say: My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me? Matthew 27:46

I do not know if we will ever be able to fully comprehend this verse in all of its importance. God forsaking God--who can understand that? Yet we know it happened, giving us feelings mixed with joy and pain. Why did God forsake Jesus on the cross?

Jesus was forsaken because God determined He would. This was no accident; it was in the eternal purpose of God's plan of redemption (Galatians 4:4-5). This was prophesied about since the beginning of the world. God would send His Son to painfully reconcile man to God and crush Satan and his power (Genesis 3:15). He would be forsaken while bearing the sins of man (Psalm 22:1). He was to be smitten of God (Isaiah 53:4). When Jesus prayed in the Garden of Gethsamane, he prayed for the cup of suffering to be removed, but it could not. God had to forsake His son to follow through with His divine plan of salvation. The prophets prophesied it; it must occur.

Jesus was forsaken because God's holiness could not look at sin. The very idea of God's holiness implies the stains of sin cannot coexist with deity. All humanity suffers from sin (Romans 3:10, 23; 1 Kings 8:46; Psalm 53:3. Isaiah 53:6; 64-6; Galatians 3:22; 1 John 1:8). When Adam and Eve brought sin into this world, death would be the consequence (Genesis 2:17; Romans 5:12). Man must be punished by death for sin (Romans 6:23). However, Jesus took our place as our sacrifice for sin, bearing the guilt which we deserve for the sins we have committed. Since God's holiness cannot coexist with sin (Isaiah 59:1-2; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9), and Jesus bore our sins on the cross (Galatians 3:13; Hebrews 9:28; 1 Peter 3:18), God must forsake Jesus at Calvary.

Jesus was forsaken because God loved us more than the love of His Son. The blessed words of Jesus ring in John 3:16, 'For God so loved the world, that He gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.' For God to love us, even at the time when we reject Him (Romans 5:8), is definitely beyond comprehension.

Jesus was forsaken because God knew Christ's purity was the only way for man's salvation to be possible. Jesus was the perfect sacrifice, because he was sinlessly perfect (Isaiah 53:9-10; 2 Corinthians 5:21; Hebrews 9:14). This was the only way because Jesus is the only one who has never sinned (I Peter 2:22; Hebrews 4:15; 7:26-27). If Christ had sinned, he would have been in need of a savior; one who needs a savior cannot be a savior. The good news is Jesus Christ is our sinless Savior. He was the spotless lamb killed for us (1 Peter 1:18-19; John 1:29).

WAS THE KINGDOM FORETOLD IN THE OLD TESTAMENT?

In the beginning God (the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit) made a plan before the creation of the world and man. This plan, also referred to as the "mystery" was the best kept secret throughout Old Testament times. The secret truth about God's plan was hidden from His people, the Israelites (Romans 16:25-27; Ephesians 1:9; 3:5,9-11). Even the angels in Heaven wanted very much to know the secret plan of God, but it was also hidden from them (see 1 Peter 1:10-12).

But God did reveal a small piece of the puzzle of the secret plan to the prophet Daniel about the coming kingdom. Daniel lived about 500 years before the birth of Christ. While he served under the Babylonian king Nebuchadnezzar, the king had a nightmarish dream about a giant statute, causing him great distress. He called his wise men together to explain or interpret the meaning of the dream. These wise men could not interpret the king's dream so he gave an order to have them killed.

God revealed the meaning of the king's dream to Daniel. Daniel went to Nebuchadnezzar and explained the meaning of his dream about the giant statue. Daniel explained that the head of gold represented the Babylonian kingdom, and three other kingdoms would come after this kingdom (Daniel 2:36-43). But during the days of the fourth kingdom, God would set up another kingdom that wo uld continue forever. This kingdom would never be destroyed and would crush all the other kingdoms of the world (Daniel 2:44).

It was God's plan through Christ to establish His kingdom during the days of the Roman Empire. Notice what Paul says in Ephesians 1:9-10, God finished His secret plan at the right time when He put it all together through Christ and made Him head of all things. This brought glory and praise because everything worked out as He had planned (Ephesians 1:11-12). It was also God's plan that His kingdom would begin in Jerusalem (note the following verses: Isaiah 2:2-3; 9:6-7; Micah 4:6-8).

As you can see, all the things God planned were fulfilled on the Day of Pentecost when Peter and the other apostles spoke to the Jews about the Christ who came to establish His kingdom (Mark 9:1; Acts 1:8; 2:1-47).





David's Prophet, Nathan come to King David and Nathan used his spiritual judgment from God, not on his (Nathan's) own, but from God to rebuke David for his sin with Bathsheba (adultery and murder of her husband Uriah, pages 15 and 16). When the Prophet of God, Nathan, had strongly rebuked David of his sin, King David fell down on the ground, broken, praying with his heart to ask his God to forgive him for his sin. But you drew that Nathan started to leave, then turned around and looked at David, and told him that "The Lord has taken away your sin." Billy, I wonder if that is really exactly what the Bible had said?

My answer is that the Bible does not say Nathan started to walk away, and then turned back to David. But I drew him doing that because I

wanted to show how terrible David's sin was, and to show how great God's gift of forgiveness is. When Nathan says these terrible words rebuking David for his sin, it should be made clear that David was brokenhearted and under God's condemnation. That is where I showed David crying and saying, "I have sinned against the Lord." When he says this, Nathan hears this. Immediately the Holy Spirit tells Nathan to tell David that his sins are forgiven. I drew Nathan's walking away to symbolize God's rejection of David. The moment David confesses his sin, I drew Nathan turning back to symbolize God forgiving him. You may have noticed that Nathan told David, "You will not die." Obviously when Nathan rebuked David for his sin, David would die for his sin. But Nathan told David he was forgiven, and that he would not die. All this is under DRAMA. It is as if you were watching actors play out the drama in a movie. You would probably see the same thing I drew.
