


















WILL YOU CONFESS TOO LATE?

Confession is the acknowledgement of something we need to show in our lives. It is important, we need to show it in our lives. It is important not only to salvation, but also to the daily life of a Christian's righteousness.

We are to confess our sins. God promised the blessing of forgiveness of sins to his children who will confess them (1 John 1:9). James said "If you have sinned, you should tell each other what you have done. Then you can pray for one another and be healed. The prayer of an innocent person is powerful, and it can help a lot," James 5:16. Spiritual healing comes by confession.

We are to confess Jesus for whom He is. Great men and women always confess. Peter said, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God," Matthew 16:16. Five confessions are found in the gospel of John. Nathaniel confessed, "Rabbi, thou art the Son of God; thou art the King of Israel" John 1:49. The Samaritan woman confessed, "Is not this the Christ?" John 4:29. Peter again confessed, "And we believe and are sure that thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God" John 6:69. Martha confessed, "I believe that thou art the Christ, the Son of God, which should come into the world" John 11:27. Thomas confessed, "My Lord and my God" after his doubts were erased, John 20:28. The Ethiopian eunuch confessed prior to his baptism, "I believe that

Jesus Christ is the Son of God," Acts 8:37. Confession is repeated in the scriptures as necessary for our salvation. Romans 10:9-10; 1 John 2:23; 4:23,15; 2 John 7.

Confession is not always easy. Even after Peter confessed Jesus twice, he later denied Jesus when the situation was different. John the Immerser confessed Jesus even in the face of the Pharisees (John 1:1518,29; Matthew 3:7). Eventually the Pharisees agreed to cast out any Jew caught confessing Jesus (John 9:22; 12:42-43). Confession of sins is also difficult. People have a hard time admitting, "I have sinned." Yet God requires it to be pleasing to Him (1 John 1:8). The confession of the prodigal son is a perfect example by Christ to show the heart of the confessor: see Luke 15:18-19. He saw his sin, confessed it and acted in a way that showed his repentance.


In direct contrast, notice the example of Achan. When Joshua lost the battle with Ai, God told him it was due to sin in the camp. So Joshua gathered the people and began to divide by tribe, family, household, and man. Achan had the opportunity to confess during this time, but did not confess his sin until it was too late. "That at the name of Jesus every name should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father," Philippians 2:10-11.

Will you confess him too late?



RUN TO WIN!

In the summer of 1996 these lessons were presented at the Christian Camp for the Deaf in Guntersville, Alabama. We thought that by adapting them in these pages, you would benefit from them also.

You know that in a race all the runners run. But only one runner gets the prize. So run like that. Run to win! All people that compete in the games use strict training. They do this so that they can win a crown (reward). That crown is an earthly thing that lasts only a short time. But our crown (reward) will continue forever. So I am like a person that has a goal. I fight like a boxer that is hitting something—not just the air. It is my own body that I hit. I make it my slave. I do this so that I myself will not be rejected (thrown out by God) after I preached to other people.

-- 1 Corinthians 9:24-27, EVD

RUN TO WIN!



Maybe you've seen marathon races like the one in Boston, Massachusetts. There are hundreds of runners running like crazy, but only **one** will win the first prize!

The Christian Race is different. In the Christian Race, everyone wins! That's what the apostle Paul means in 1 Corinthians 9:24-27.

If you're going to join in a marathon race, what do you do? You must have a goal! That means self control! You must eat and drink the right things! You must exercise regularly! You must run every day! Then you will be ready for the big race!

You know how in the Olympics they grant the gold medals, the silver medals and the bronze medals. But in

Paul's time they didn't give medals. They gave crowns of leaves to the winners. These crowns of leaves lasted only a short time. They wilted and became good for nothing except to throw away! But the reward given to all people who finish the Christian Race is Life Forever. It is a "crown" that will never fade away.

So when Paul prepared for the Christian Race, he announced he had a goal. He really aimed at this goal. He did not "shadow-box" (hitting the air). He controlled his own body. "It is my own body that I hit. I make it my slave." Why? "So that I myself will not be rejected (thrown out)".




If an Olympic athlete was caught drinking alcohol or taking drugs, he would be thrown out. He would not be allowed to participate in the games.

So when you yourself think about running the Christian Race, remember you must:

- (1) Have a goal.
- (2) Have self-control.

The Lord is waiting to give you a glorious crown at the end of the Christian Race. Will you keep running?



The true olympic winner will not involve himself with drugs or alcohol or anything that harms his body. He will eat a balanced diet and keep his body healthy!



Exercising regularly keeps your body healthy and strong. The same is true for your soul!



TAKE AWAY WHAT STOPS US!

Do you know why Olympic athletes are tested for drugs? It is to stop them from cheating. If a person is found to be taking drugs, he will be disqualified. He will not be permitted to take part in the contests. You will see how important this is to our lesson today.

The 11th chapter of Hebrews tells about many Old Testament people who lived in faith. The stories

of these people are good lessons for us. They tell us how to live in faith, and they tell us God will reward us for our faith. When the writer of Hebrews finishes with the stories of the many different people in Hebrews 11, he moves on to Hebrews 12:1-2, our Bible reading for today. Go back and re-read what this passage says.

Did you notice that the FVD translation of our Bible passage points out that the lives of the faithful people in Hebrews 11 tell us "what faith means"? People do not understand about "faith". They think



their lives.

"faith" means just going to church services and sitting listening to a dull sermon.

But in Hebrews 11:3 we are told what "faith" means: "Faith means being sure of the things we hope for. And faith means knowing that something is real even if we don't see it" . We know God and Jesus are real, even if we can't see them right now. And we know we have a home in eternity waiting for us!

That's why the writer of Hebrews warns us to take away from our lives anything that would stop us. Is it a movie or TV show that shows too much of the evil side of life? Is it the wrong kind of companionship we keep? Is it alcohol? Or drugs? Etc., etc.

The writer of Hebrews also says we should take away the sin that so easily catches us. Many of us have


"pet sins". One person would not be bothered by friends trying to tempt him to drink beer. But that same person might be bothered by the temptation to steal. We should know what our "pet sins" are and stay away from them!

Finally, the writer of Hebrew points us to Jesus. He is the leader of our faith! Jesus gave us a good example

in His life on earth. He is waiting for us to finish running the race so He can give us the Crown of Life!




It is sad when a person thinks there is too much trouble to be a Christian any longer. So they give up and go into the world and enjoy its sinful pleasures. But





Will you stay faithful to Christ until the end (Matthew 10:22)? Then your running will not be for nothing! You will be a winner!




The olympic winner in Paul's time received only a crown of leaves. The leaves shortly after wilted and died. You certainly couldn't hang it on your wall in your room!



But the crown that Jesus is waiting to give us at the end of our "race" will last forever and ever! Read 1 Corinthians 9:25 and 2 Timothy 4:18.

Paul was near the end of his life. He was kept as a prisoner by the Romans. While he was in prison, he wrote a letter to his faithful helper Timothy. That is when Paul told Timothy the words of our Bible reading.


Without doubt Timothy felt sad because he knew Paul would die soon. In his letter Paul begged Timothy to hurry and see him before winter (2 Timothy 4:21). Winter was a bad time for sea travel then. The ships would stay in their harbors. They would not sail. We do not know if Timothy succeeded in going to see Paul in prison before the Romans killed him. Nothing in the Bible or even in history tells us what Timothy did. But we think there was one thing that made Timothy happy. He was happy because Paul said, "I have fought the good fight. I have finished the race. I have kept the faith." Paul

was faithful! He did not leave the Lord. He stayed faithful to the Lord. He stayed faithful even when that led him to death. So, since Paul fought the good fight, finished the race, and kept the faith, Timothy knew he would see Paul again in heaven.

Jesus said, "But the person that continues strong to the end will be saved" (Matthew 24:13). He later told another apostle, John, "But be faithful, even if you have to die. If you continue faithful, then I will give you the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10).

And as the time for his death came near, Paul said, "Now, a crown (reward) is waiting for me. I will get that crown for being right with God. The Lord is the Judge who judges rightly. He will give me the crown on that Day. Yes! He will give that crown to me. He will give that crown to all people who have wanted Him to come again and have waited for Him" (2 Timothy 4:8).

Can you be confident you will have a Crown of Life waiting for you at the end of the Christian Race? Will you stay faithful to the Lord all the way to the end of your life? It is up to you! And it will be worth it!



Will We Be Conscious After We Die?

Will we lose consciousness at the moment of death? Will our souls live on after we die? Have you ever wondered where our souls would go after we die? There are those in the denominational world that believe that our souls will sleep in the grave until Jesus comes again and will awaken us from our slumber. But Jesus taught just the opposite to His disciples about what would happen right after death.

Jesus is the only One who can give us some help on this subject. In Luke 16:19-31, He used the example of the Rich Man and Lazarus to show that they were fully conscious and aware of what was happening to them right after they died. The rich man went to a place of suffering (torment or tartarus) and Lazarus to a place of comfort (paradise) with Abraham You will note in this story that there is a "Great Gulf" seperating paradise from torment.

In torment the rich man was in pain and cried out to Abraham for a little water to cool his tongue. Remember Jesus promised the thief on the cross next to him that he would be with Him in paradise that very day after he died (see Luke 23:43). Moses was fully conscious when he and Elijah spoke with Jesus on the Mount of the Transfiguration, even though he had died many centuries before (Matthew 17:3). (Elijah did not really die; he was taken up to heaven, see 2 Kings

2:11.) Enoch was also taken to be with God, see Genesis 5:24. In Revelation 6:9-11, the souls of those who had been martyred (killed) during the tribulation (during the destruction of Jerusalem in A D. 70) were conscious in heaven and speaking to God.

In Luke 20:38, Jesus says that "He is not the God of the dead, but of the living, for to Him all are alive." Our God has often told His people that He is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, which means that He is the God of the living, not of the dead! Therefore Abraham, Isaac and Jacob are alive, fully conscious and with God. God's Word is very clear that the souls of both believers and unbelievers are fully conscious from death until the time Jesus returns. For further study on this subject see the following verses: Ecclesiastes 12:7; Matthew 10:28; John 11:26; Philippians 1:23; 1 Thessalonians 4:17.

The Ten Virgins

A study of Matthew 25:1-13

If we are to understand the full meaning of the story of the ten virgins, then we must go back to Matthew 24 where Jesus was teaching His followers about the importance of getting ready.

He was teaching His followers on the Mount of Olives on His way to Bethany (Matthew 24:3; 26:6). Jesus knew that there was not much time left in the final week of His earthly ministry. He saw the great need for teaching this very important lesson as the only way to help His followers to deal with future problems. He was telling His followers to be ready when terrible things are going to happen in their lifetime.



He warned them that they will suffer many things until the city of Jerusalem is destroyed (Matthew 24:1-25). But He promised them that they will see SIGNS of the coming of the Son of Man (meaning His coming judgment against the city of Jerusalem, Matthew 24:26-35).

Then He talked about His Second Coming and the Final Judgment of the whole world (Matthew 24:36-51). He warned all of His followers to be ready at all times because there will be NO SIGNS given of His Second Coming. He used the story of the ten virgins to make His lesson clear.

Jesus' warning is given in Matthew 25:13 as follows: "So always be ready. You don't know the day or the time when the Son of Man will come." The story in His teaching is about the ten virgins waiting at night for the coming of the bridegroom to receive the bride. From this story we learn:



1. That Christ Is Coming.

He is the bridegroom--the One that we will meet. He will come at midnight--a time when we do not expect His coming (1 Thessalonians 5:1 -3). But He puts off His coming for two reasons: (1) That all of us may be ready (2 Peter 3:9), and (2) That all things may be restored (Acts 3:21).

2. That we should be ready.

This does not mean for us to watch constantly for Jesus' coming through the clouds (Acts 1:10-12). Neither does it mean that we must give up our jobs and wait for His coming (2 Thessalonians 3:11-12). Again, we should not get excited over what people say, like when they talked about the "Y2K crash"; they thought that when January 1, 2000 came around, many things would go wrong. People think that these are the signs of His coming. But the Bible makes it clear that there will be no sign of His coming and that there will be no exact dates and times of His coming (2 Thessalonians 2:1-2). Matthew 24:36 says, "No person knows when that day or time will be. The Son and the angels in heaven don't know when that day or time will be. Only the Father knows."

However, we need to be ready for two reasons: (1) The word "oil" inside the lamps and vessels represents our *faith* (Mark 11:22; Hebrews 11:6). (2) These lamps and vessels

are necessary to hold oil. What good can oil do without lamps and vessels? In the same way, faith must reside inside us, the vessels of God. The Christian life is a life of action, showing faith rather than doing nothing (Galatians 5:6; James 2:17).

3. Why we should be ready.

Jesus says that we "don't know the day or the time" when

He comes again. Jesus may come later than some expect, or earlier than others expect. Warning: people gave false predictions that Jesus would come again in the year 2000. If you study church history, you will find that these false predictions are not new. For example, people thought that Jesus would come in the year 1000, but nothing happened! Life went on as usual for the next 1,000 years!



Jesus' coming will show if the ten virgins are ready or not. Will

they have enough oil in their lamps and vessels? Will His sudden, unexpected coming surprise and catch them unprepared for eternity? Until the groom arrived, all ten girls looked the same—all ten girls were virgins, all of them had lamps and vessels, all of them were waiting for His coming. But when the groom came, all the differences appeared. The same will be true when Jesus comes (1 Corinthians 4:5)!

The five wise girls could not help the other five foolish girls. Oil is a personal thing that cannot be passed from one person to another person—something that cannot be exchanged between these virgins. After Jesus arrives, these five foolish girls will not be able to find the time to get ready. There comes a time in life after which it is impossible to change. The door of opportunity will be shut once for all time.


Let us consider how the door may be shut: (1) Through

death—"Every person must die once. After a person dies he is judged" (Hebrews 9:27). (2) Beyond a person's ability to repent (1 John 5:16-17). (3) By the Lord's Second Coming. When Jesus comes, it will be too late to repent or to obey the gospel!


What does the closed door mean to the ten virgins? To the five wise girls, it means security and peace. To the five foolish girls, it means sadness and feelings of no hope.


Christians are like the ten virgins waiting for Christ's coming in a long night of feeling not sure when He will ever come. We cannot depend on Y2K or any other times to predict His coming. Jesus' point in His parable of the ten virgins is that those Christians who claim to be Jesus' followers should always be faithful, waiting, and ready to receive Him when He comes. don't wait till His coming to make ready! Those Christians who are not ready will hear the Lord reply, "I tell you the truth. I don't know you" (Matthew 25:12).

Ready or not, think about this!





The Bible verse Rev. 22:1-4, tree of life, bare twelve manner of fruits and yielded fruit every month. Does that mean in heaven we will need food? Will we drink living water there?

The book of Revelation is full of *figurative language*, or "cartoon" language. The "cartoons" have meanings, much like our editorial cartoons in our newspapers today. When we see a cartoon of an elephant and a donkey fighting, we understand it means the Republicans and Democrats are racing each other for election. When we see a cartoon of a tall, thin man with a white goatee and a tall hat and striped pants, we know it represents "Uncle Sam", which in turn represents the U.S. government. Some people misunderstand many passages in the book of Revelation, and think they are *literal* (real). But they are figurative (full of "cartoons"), not literal (real). The strong angel, the chain, the bottomless pit, the red dragon, etc., all in Revelation 20, are "cartoons".

So the passage you ask me about-- the tree of life growing twelve kinds of fruits every month-- is also *figurative*, or "cartoon" language. Revelation 22:1-5 reads:

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life. The river was bright like crystal. The river flows from the throne of God and the Lamb. It flows down the middle of the street of the city. The tree of life was on each side of the river. The tree of life makes fruit twelve times a year. It gives fruit every month. The leaves of the tree are for healing all the people. Nothing that God judges guilty will be there in that city. The throne of God and the Lamb (Jesus) will be in the city. God's servants will worship him.

They will see his face. God's name will be written on their foreheads. There will never be night again. People will not need the light of a lamp or the light of the sun. The Lord God will give them light. And they will rule like kings forever and ever, (EVD)

Can you imagine real, genuine water flowing from God's throne? Would the water flowing down the middle of the street mean it is a divider much like the concrete dividers of our highways? It is obvious these are not meant to be *literal* (real), but *symbols*, or *cartoons*.

Also, many people reading this passage think this is a description of heaven. A careful study of this passage shows it is not at all talking about heaven! It is talking about the Christian life! Some of our readers may be upset with us. But again, read carefully.

Notice that while Jesus was on the Earth, He said, "If a person believes in Me, rivers of living water will flow out from his heart..." (John 7:38). The next verse makes it clear: "Jesus was talking about the Holy Spirit. The Spirit had not yet been given to people, because Jesus had not yet died and been raised to glory. But later, those people that believed in Jesus would receive the Spirit."

So the "water" flowing from God's Throne probably represents the Holy Spirit that He is continually giving to all His people who continually obey Him (Acts 5:32). The brightness like a crystal means the clearness and purity of the "water", or Holy Spirit. The Tree of Life, sitting on each side of the river represents Eternal Life that God gives to us. When the Bible says it grows fruit twelve months a year, the meaning is that Eternal Life is not limited to a short time. The "city" means the church. If a person is in Christ, then God does not judge him guilty (see Romans 8:1). People who have accepted Christ as their Savior now "rule on the earth" (see Revelation 5:10).
